I. GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The RCY Bohol Summer Camp 2018 aims to raise awareness among its participants in emergencies concerning all hazards, including all activities and risk management measures related to prevention and mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery. Further, it also aims to enhance leadership skills and decisiveness of our youth that is vital for their growth and future.

J. METHODOLOGY

The camp will be having plenary sessions and interaction which will compose of expert speakers in the field of first aid, disaster risk reduction management, psychological first aid and health promotion during disaster.

In order to test their learning, experiences, attitude and other necessary skills for survival, the participants will be having outdoor activities and games throughout the duration of the event. The participants will be divided into groups in order to interact with co-participants coming from other delegations. One of the camp's highlights is the annual Solferino Race, the Red Cross Youth-way teambuilding activity, in which the participants will face various challenges that will test their trust, unity and cooperation with one another.

There will be 200 expected youth participants with an age range of 13-25 years old. This camp is for all our Red Cross Youth Volunteers and to Non-RCY who are interested in volunteering in our prestigious International Humanitarian Organization.
