

2018 NATIONAL SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMP OF THE SACEDA YOUTH LEAD

The Saceda Youth Lead (SYL) will conduct the 2018 National Summer Leadership Camp (NSLC) on the following dates with respective venues:

Leg	Date	Venue
Visayas	April 24–30, 2018	Saceda Youth Lead Center Purok Likod, Candau-ay Dumaguete City
Luzon	May 1–7, 2018	San Juan Central School San Juan, La Union

The Camp aims to:

1. define leadership and leadership development;
2. enumerate the elements of team effectiveness;
3. define whether a leader is born or made;
4. provide participants with opportunities to assist in the community service programs of the local government unit agencies like Operation *Tuli*, Clean Up Drive along river banks and coasts, feeding the less fortunate, or visitation of the inmates of the provincial/city jails, as well as meet local leaders and gain inspiration from them;
5. challenge participants to hurdle 23 obstacle courses in each city leg for their team building activities; and
6. demonstrate how leadership theories are actualized in practice in the series of programs and events at the NSLC.

The target participants are students enrolled in both public and private elementary and secondary schools, aged 10–19 years old, youth leaders serving in the *barangay*, school clubs and organizations, teacher-advisers involved in student government and nongovernment organizations, and nongovernment organization workers.

Participation of both public and private schools shall be subject to the no-disruption-of-classes policy stipulated in DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 entitled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith and the policy on off-campus activities stated in DepEd Order No. 66, s. 2017 entitled Implementing Guidelines on the Conduct of Off-campus Activities. This is also subject to the no-collection policy as stated in Section 3 of Republic Act No. 5546 also known as An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Tickets and/or the Collection of Contributions for Whatever Project or Purpose from Students and Teachers of Public and Private Schools, Colleges and Universities (Ganzon Law).
