GENERAL GUIDELINES

- 1.
2. Confirmation to join LitMus is a must. Schools that confirmed their participation will only be considered as official participants. Participating schools should confirm through our official email upkbiloiolochapter@gmail.com or our contact number **0910 757 1963**. Deadline for the confirmation will be on October 31, 2018.
3. Violation of Rule 2 [for disqualification from the LitMus Competition.](#)
4. Schools which will attend the event but did not confirm with the organizers within the confirmation period are disqualified from the competition but shall be allowed to perform.
5. Participating schools are required to attend the LitMus orientation. Failure to attend the LitMus Orientation will [disqualification from the LitMus Competition.](#) Date and venue for the orientation will be announced soon.
6. Participating schools must strictly observe the deadline set for the submission of requirements (e.g. registration forms, scripts, CD's). Deadline for the submission of requirements will be on the day of the LitMus Orientation. Participating schools must submit in advance through our official email upkbiloiolochapter@gmail.com.
7. The list of participants in the official registration form is final. In case an official participant is substituted because s/he could not perform due to valid reasons, the school must submit necessary documents (e.g. medical certificate) as proof.
8. Violation of Rule 7 entails a *three-point deduction* from the **Contest Total Score** where an unexcused substitution of a contestant was made. Should there be multiple invalid changes of contestants, *three points* shall be deducted from the total score for every contestant invalidly changed.
9. All participants and coaches must be at the venue 30 minutes before the start of the event. A five-point deduction shall be made to the school's **Over-all Champion Points** for every 15-minute late.
10. Every school shall have only one competing group for each category. Participants must be bona fide students of their respective schools.
11. Contestants are prohibited from wearing their school uniform or using any object as props that will reveal their school identity.
12. Violation of Rules 10 and 11 [for disqualification from the category where such violation occurred.](#)
13. Vulgar words or indecent actions are not allowed. Proper decorum of participants, coaches, and non-participants supporting the school should be observed throughout the event.

14. A participating group must not be less than nor more than the number of members specified for each category.
15. Violation of Rules 13 and 14 is a ground for prohibition from further performance in all categories and is subject to disqualification from the competition.
16. A performance will be stopped immediately (by turning off microphones, accompaniment and instruments) if the performers reach the maximum allowable overtime. The maximum overtime is determined to be 30% of the maximum allotted time per contest.
17. The decision of the board of judges and the organizers is final and irrevocable.
18. Participating school with a consecutive 5-time championship title will not be permitted to join LitMus Competition on the following year. Participation will be granted back through invitation after the permission is given by the executive committee.
19. Should there be any complaints regarding the outcome of the event, a letter of complaint that is duly signed by the school head shall be sent to the organizers not later than Monday, January 07, 2018. The letter shall be e-mailed to upkbioloilochapter@gmail.com.

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Vocal Duet

1. The contest is a musical performance of two voices either composed of two males, two females, or a combination of both.
2. The song must be an Original Pinoy Music (OPM), and
3. The contestants must have their own accompaniment stored in Compact Discs (CD's) with the proper label: Vocal Duet – [name of school], to be submitted to the organizers on the day of the LitMus orientation. Participating schools must submit in advance through our official email
4. Costumes and props are allowed to be used. Props must not exceed 2.5 meters in height, and one meter in length and thickness. Props that exceed the said dimensions are not allowed to be set on the stage.
5. The performance must not exceed five minutes, and a point shall be deducted from the total score for every 10-second overtime. Maximum overtime for vocal duet shall be 1.5 minutes (90 sec).
6. The stage must be cleared from all props (e.g. confetti, chairs, etc.) after the performance. The participating school can ask for assistance from members of their respective school in clearing the stage.
7. The timer starts when the music starts and ends when the stage is fully cleared from participants and props.

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Group A cappella

1. The contest is performed only by using sound produced by the mouth without the aid of any instrumental accompaniment. Contestants are not allowed to use other body parts to produce sound (e.g. clapping of hands, stomping of feet).
2. The contestants shall be composed of a minimum of three and a maximum of five members composed of either all male, all female, or a combination of both.
3. The piece may be of any genre and language. The piece can be a single track or a mash-up of different songs.
4. The performance may be done with choreography. However, performers are **prohibited** from using props.
5. The performance must not exceed five minutes and a point shall be deducted from the total score for every ten-second overtime. The timer starts when the first note is sung or pitch pipe is blown; time ends when the stage is cleared.
6. Maximum overtime for Group A cappella shall be 1.5 minutes (90 sec).

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Comical Duo

1. Comical duo is a comic pairing in which humor is derived from the uneven relationship between two partners with different personalities or behaviors. Each pair may be composed of all male, all female, or a combination of both.
2. Each pair should make their own comical skit with a theme that showcases *the theme of the contest*. Contestants are prohibited from using real names of persons, businesses, places, events and institutions.
3. Vulgar words and indecent actions are not allowed (*see General Guidelines*).
4. Performance must not promote violence and discrimination of all sorts and must uphold gender-sensitivity and respect for differences in beliefs.
5. **Three copies of the script** must be submitted to the organizers on the day of the LitMus orientation. Participating schools must submit in advance through our official email *upkbioloilochapter@gmail.com*.
6. Costumes and props are allowed to be used. Props must not exceed 2.5 meters in height, and one meter in length and thickness. Props that exceed the said dimensions are not allowed to be set on the stage.
7. The stage must be cleared from all props (e.g. confetti, chairs, etc.) after the performance. The participating school can ask for assistance from members of their respective school in clearing the stage.
8. The timer starts when the participants start performing and ends when the stage is fully cleared from participants and props.
9. A time of seven minutes is allotted for the whole presentation.
10. From the total score, a point shall be deducted for every 10 - second overtime. Maximum overtime for Comical Duo shall be 2.1 minutes (126 sec).

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Modern Jazz

1. Modern jazz is a dance that uses contemporary moves of jazz which are marked by harmonic and rhythmic complexity such as pivot turn, change step, and the like.
2. The performers may use local or foreign dance tunes as they are classified as modern or popular music.
3. Each group shall be composed of a minimum of six and a maximum of ten members either composed of all male, all female, or a combination of both.
4. The stage must be cleared from all props (e.g. confetti, chairs, etc.) after the performance. The participating school can ask for assistance from members of their respective school in clearing the stage.
5. The timer starts when the participants start performing and ends when the stage is fully cleared from participants and props.
6. Costumes and props are allowed to be used. Props must not exceed 2.5 meters in height, and one meter in length and thickness. Props that exceed the said dimensions are not allowed to be set on the stage.
7. The performance must not exceed seven minutes.
8. From the total score, a point shall be deducted for every 10-second overtime. Maximum overtime for Modern Jazz shall be 2.1 minutes (126 sec).

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Battle of the Bands

1. This is a contest between bands composed of students who will perform songs using musical instruments and their vocals.
2. Each group shall be composed of a minimum of six and a maximum of 12 members, either composed of all male, all female, or a combination of both.
3. Three songs will be played during the set:
The set should not contain vulgarity, profanities, indecent and racist remarks, and violence.
4. The band may choose the sequence of the songs they will perform.
5. Performers must provide their own instruments (except drum set), amplifiers, and cables. Performers may use different musical instruments.
6. **Three copies of the lyrics** of the original composition must be submitted to the organizers on the day of the LitMus orientation. Participating schools must submit in advance through our official email upkbiloilochapter@gmail.com.
7. A total of 20 minutes will be given to each performing band. This will already include both the entrance (e.g. setting up of the instruments and equipment) and exit.
8. Only the coach of the participating team may assist in setting up of instruments and equipment. Non-performing members of the participating school are not allowed on the stage and such action will result in disqualification.
9. From the total score, a point shall be deducted for every 10-second overtime with a maximum overtime of six minutes.
9. A special award will also be given for the Best Original Composition (*see criteria for Best Original Composition*).

Criteria for Overall Performance:

I. Music

- a. Instrumentation 20%
- b. Lyrical Content 15%
- c. Clarity 5%

II. Original Material

- a. Difficulty of Piece 20%
- b. Originality 20%

III. Impact

- a. Overall Performance 10%
- b. Stage Presence and Crowd Interaction 5%
- c. Audience Impact 5%

Criteria for Best Original Composition:

- Lyrical Content 35%
- Melody and Rhythm 30%
- Voice and Clarity 30%
- Audience Impact 5%

CONTEST GUIDELINES & CRITERIA

Advocacy Video

1. The Advocacy video competition requires each participating schools to produce a video that
2. The advocacy video should be a minimum of three minutes and a maximum of five minutes in length.
3. Each participating school is required to submit their video on or before December 21, 2018. Three days are allotted for late submission though it will entail to a one point deduction per day.
4. The video should include the logo of Litmus Dise Sais and should appear at the end of the video. The logo will be provided by the organizers and will be available on the official page of Litmus Dise Sais.
5. The videos submitted by each participating schools shall be uploaded on the official Facebook page of Litmus Dise Sais (UP Kadugong Bol-anon Litmus) on December 24, 2018.
6. Each participating schools are encouraged to view and share their videos. The number of **shares** of the video will be counted and shall be part of the criteria. Deadline for counting of shares will be on January 3, 2018 – 11:59 PM.
7. A point shall be deducted for every ten-second overtime in the video. Maximum overtime shall be 1.5 minutes (90 sec).

TABULATION OF SCORES

1. The tabulation of scores shall be thoroughly explained and discussed during the LitMus Orientation.
2. The tabulation of scores per contest shall be done using the POINT system. The *Contest Score (CS)* is defined to be the sum of the individual criterion points. The *Contest Total Score (CTS)*, which is defined to be the sum of the judges' *contest scores*, shall be ranked (1st place corresponds to the highest CTS and so on).
3. The *Over-all Champion* is determined using the weight system. (See table below)
 - The *Contest Points (CP)* is determined to be the rank multiplied by the contest weight. ($CP = \text{rank} \times \text{contest weight}$)
 - A default (not joining a contest) earns the school *Default Points (DP)*. ($DP = \text{contest weight} \times \text{number of participating schools in the competition}$).
 - The *Over-all Champion Points (OCP)* is defined to be the sum of the *Contest Points* and *Default Points* earned by each participating school.
4. The school garnering the lowest Grand Total Points (OCP - Penalties) shall be declared the *Over-all Champion*.
5. In case of a tie in the contests, the competing team with the higher CTS shall receive the bigger trophy. In case of ties in CTS's, a tie breaker that is duly prepared by the organizers should solve the problem.
6. Lastly, there shall be only one *Over-all Champion*. In case of a tie in OCP, the school that garnered the most number of first place winnings shall be declared as champion.
