

The Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Regional Center for Educational Innovation and Technology (SEAMEO INNOTECH), in close collaboration with the Department of Education, is undertaking a research project to develop a framework for understanding motivation among public and private school teachers in the Philippines. The research shall answer the general question, "What motivates teachers to join and remain in the Philippine basic education system?"

In this connection, SEAMEO INNOTECH will be gathering data through the conduct of interviews and an online survey among selected public and private school teachers. As articulated during the 11th National Management Committee (MANCOM) Meeting held in Zamboanga City last 10 August 2018, the support of all concerned offices is hereby requested, specifically through the following:

- 1. Facilitation and provision of logistical support in the conduct of teacher interviews to be administered by researchers from SEAMEO INNOTECH
 - To ensure utmost confidentiality and to protect informants' identities, the research team shall get in touch directly with interview informants and need not seek clearance from the informants' supervising officers.
 - The research team shall ensure that interviews will not be undertaken during official class hours to avoid disruptions in teaching schedules.
 - The interviews shall cover a range of questions such as those related to teachers' socio-economic and demographic background, educational preparation and

professional experiences, professional development, motivations for joining and remaining in the teaching profession, and reflections on how the motivation of basic education teachers can be improved. Based on the pretesting of the interview guide, each interview might last between 2-3 hours.

2. Circulation of the online survey to teachers within the region/division

- a. To ensure representation of teachers from across the regions, concerned officials at all governance levels shall ensure the circulation of the online survey which shall be developed by the research team. Specifically, the study aims to have representation from the following:
 - Teachers from public and private schools
 - Teachers from multi-grade schools
 - Teachers across different educational levels
 - Kindergarten
 - Elementary
 - Junior High school
 - Senior High school
 - Teachers from rural (remote) areas
 - Ideally, belonging to an IP group
 - Ideally, coming from the ARMM or conflict-affected areas
 - Teachers from urban (accessible) areas
 - Teachers representing different career stages identified in the Philippine Professional Standards for Teachers (PPST) i.e. beginning, proficient, highly-proficient, and distinguished teachers to ensure representation across different generations
 - Career shifters (e.g. professionals from different fields who joined the teaching profession as a second career)

· 3. Provision of other data requirements as required for the successful implementation of the research project

a. All concerned officials are requested to provide school/division/department-level data as necessary for the project. An initial request for data has been relayed to the DepEd Information and Communications Technology Service (ICTS), but further supplemental information may still be needed throughout the project period to provide more context to the research on teacher motivation in the country.

In view of the foregoing, the Senior Education Program Specialist (SEPS) for Planning and Research or their alternates in the SDOs are hereby identified as focal in charge of ensuring that the abovestated points of support are provided to researchers from SEAMEO INNOTECH.
