The award has the following objectives :

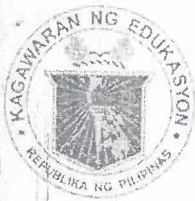

This is with reference to the letter from the Royal Thai Embassy on the request for nomination of the 3rd Princess Maha Chakri Award.

The Award has the following objectives:

1. To pay the highest honor to Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn for Her outstanding achievements in the fields of education and the development of people's quality of life, especially the disadvantaged;
2. To honor and give recognition to dedicated teachers in Southeast Asia whose outstanding achievements generate benefits to education and human development and deserve international recognition;
3. To support the development of the teaching profession and educational development; and
4. To strengthen international relations in the field of education.

It is mandatory for each region to send at least **one (1) nominee** to the Department of Education International Cooperation Office. Potential candidates are those who are still active in teaching or administration at the primary and secondary education levels (pre-tertiary), and who have inspired fellow teachers with their dedication to students in the country. The nomination process will be conducted by the PH Princess Maha Chakri Awards (PMCA) PH Committee to be composed of Executive Committee Members, Directors and other officers concerned once all regions have submitted their nominee. The selection must be under the theme/concept: *the quality of education hinges on the quality of teachers; on the quality of teachers reflects the development of quality generation.*

The regions will do their respective selection of nominees using the theme mentioned above, and criteria set by the awards:

1. Outstanding achievement which generate benefits to education and human development
2. Active in teaching or administration at the primary or secondary levels

3. Has inspired fellow teachers with their dedication to students in the country

One teacher from each Southeast Asian country will be selected as awardees. The Princess Maha Chakri Award will comprise of: (a) a medal; (b) a certificate of honor; (c) an honorary brooch; and (d) a cheque worth 10,000USD. Previous awardees of various awarding bodies are still welcome to apply.

The awardee will be invited to a royal award presentation ceremony in Bangkok, Thailand where they will present their outstanding achievements and share their knowledge with fellow awardees for the benefit of the profession. The list of awardees and brief descriptions of their work or innovations will be publicized through media and sent to relevant agencies in their countries.

Minimum requirements:

1. Copy of Passport
2. Updated Personal Data Sheet (CS Form 212)
3. 1500 word essay by the nominee stating why he/she should receive the Award
4. Letter of nomination addressed to the Secretary, Leonor Magtolis Briones, (attention: Director Margarita Consolacion C. Ballesteros, International Cooperation Office) signed by the Regional Director or its duly authorized official
5. Matrix to summarize the activities done, awards received and accomplishments relevant to the award accompanied by supporting documents (spell out acronyms of organizer/s and topic/s or subjects of the training; certificates of training need not be submitted). *Attached as Annex A is the format of the matrix*
6. Certified true copy of service record
7. Certification that the nominee has no pending administrative and criminal case

In this regard, we would like to request your good office to screen the submissions and choose only (1) one nominee per region to be submitted to the Princess Maha Chakri Awards (PMCA) Awards Committee PH through the International Cooperation Office (ICO) on or before 15 January 2019. Princess Maha Chakri Award is a royally-bestowed international award dedicated to honour exceptionally devoted teachers in basic education from 11 countries in Southeast Asia and to honour HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn for her wisdom and life-long contribution to education both domestically and internationally.

The Princess Maha Chakri Award is administered by the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation in cooperation with the Teachers Council of Thailand under the Ministry of Education, the Quality Learning Foundation and a number of relevant agencies. The inaugural award ceremony took place on 2 October 2015 to celebrate the auspicious occasion of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's 60th birthday anniversary observed on 2 April 2015 and on the occasion of World Teachers' Day 2015. The selection is made every 2 years.

Description of the Award

The Princess Maha Chakri Award is presented to dedicated teachers whose outstanding performance has made great contribution to education and human development in the 11 countries in Southeast Asia namely Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Timor-Leste, Vietnam and Thailand. One teacher from each of the 11 countries will be selected to receive the prestigious award.

The Princess Maha Chakri Award comprises of:

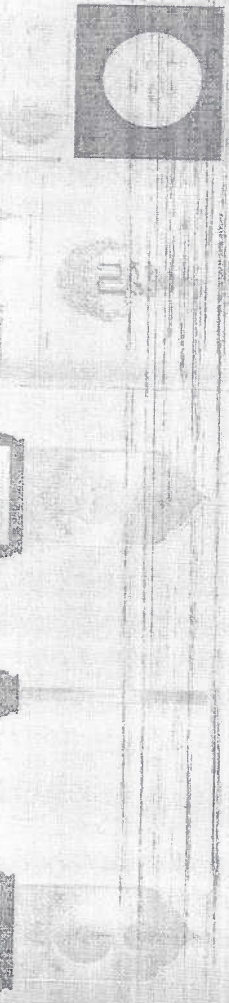
1. Princess Maha Chakri medal
2. A certificate of honour
3. An honorary brooch
4. USD 10,000 prize money

Nomination Criteria

The award candidate must be a teacher from one of 11 countries in Southeast Asia whose work has created impact and contributed to education and human development will be entitled for the Princess Maha Chakri Award nomination. The nomination process will be conducted by the Ministry of Education in each country under the concept: the quality of education hinges on the quality of teachers; the quality of teachers reflects the development of quality generation.



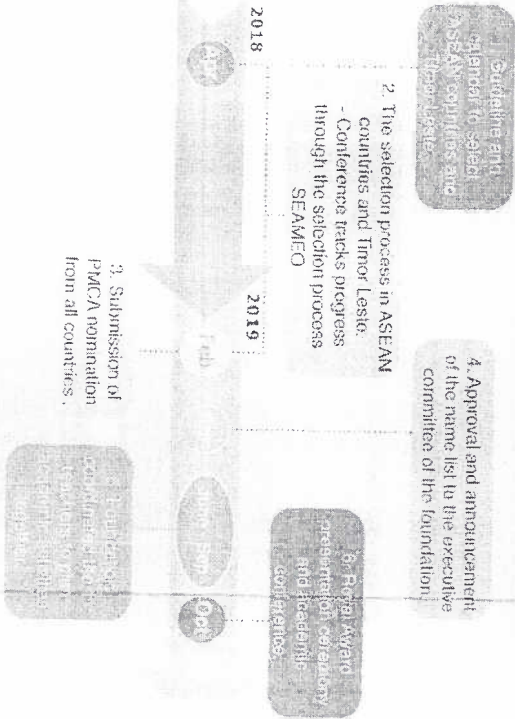
Medal, Certificate of Honour, Honorary Plaque,

Selection of the Awardees

- Ministry of Education in each of 11 Southeast Asian countries consisting of ASEAN countries and Timor-Leste, will be responsible for selecting candidates in accordance to the award criteria. Only one teacher can be nominated by each country.
- Details of the qualified candidates for the award, nomination and selection criteria, time frames, and nomination process will be determined by the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation Committee, for more information please refer to www.PMCA.or.th
- Final selection decision of awardees of the Princess Maha Chakri Award will be made by the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation Committee.

The Recipients of the Princess Maha Chakri Award 2017



Brunei Darussalam : Mdm Lim Soh Ngo

A science teacher whose teaching method enable students to achieve optimum learning performance. Mrs. Lim Soh Ngo teaches Chemistry at Mikhael Duli Pangrahan Maya Al-Mansadec Sultan College, a high school in Brunei Darussalam. She makes Chemistry learning fun. Her teaching method enables students to generate critical thinking and social skills. She explores the student's aptitude and potential and help them maximize it. She is also a mentor for other teachers in her school, at her district and at the national level. Mrs. Lim won the Excellence Service Medal in 2011 and the honorable Expertise Award in 2015 from the Sultan of Brunei.



Cambodia : Mrs. Dy Sophorn

A determined teacher who dedicated her life to the importance of teaching and education that creates a bright future for both students and the nation. Mrs. Dy Sophorn teaches English at Kunrou Krong Primary School, Cambodia. She creates the so-called 'Happy class' filled with positive teaching and learning atmosphere. She believes that if takes family, school and society to support students to grow up in the environment with high quality education and it is really essential for future success. Her twenty years of dedication in teaching services has been proven by receiving Sarodac, Queen Sen Award in 2017.



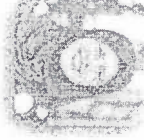
Indonesia : Mr. Encon Rahman

A teacher who creates aspiration to educational and teaching development in Indonesia. Mr. Encon Rahman teaches mathematics, science and social studies at Makrowang Public Elementary School. He dedicates himself to teaching and educational development. He helps his students learn better through the development of multiple learning plan. He is also a facilitator of the method of raising the Indonesian national standard. He inspired other teachers in West Java and gives a major role in educational development.



Laos PDR : Mrs. Khounvilly Khenkittack

An outstanding science administrator who unites teacher's and administrators to enhance towards student development. Mrs. Khounvilly is an educational administrator of Thongkang primary school. She is a science principal who introduce participatory approach to teacher and community to be used for effective student development. She is one of the core team in developing Curriculum & Textbooks at primary level for the Ministry of Education Lao PDR.



Malaysia : Ms. Hajah Sarifah Binti Embong

A teacher who come from pioneer age innovators, and creating a great and knowledge during daily life processes. Ms. Sarifah teaches English, mathematics, science and technology at Istana Yayasan Terengganu. She teaches her students to use creative ideas to solve problems in their daily lives. She guides them with projects that enable them to develop their own creative and innovative products. As a result, her students won several innovative awards both at national and international levels.



Myanmar : Mr. Than Tun

An exceptional teacher who gives students of the center English with the cultivation of life skills and virtues. Mr. Than Tun teaches English of Basic Education High School in Yangon region. By using in practice student centered teaching method, the award-winning teacher help Grade 9 students pass English examination at state and regional levels every year. He coordinates with the community in promoting school learning for youths' vegetable and health care. Students are also taught to be excellent in both academic and morality.



Philippines : Dr. Jesus Insitlada

A teacher who instates an inclusive learning and culture-based education. An author who takes the pride of local identity. Dr. Jesus Insitlada is currently with the Campaner National High School located at Barangay Camanguan, Iloilo Philippines. Dr. Insitlada initiates and inclusive learning and culture-based education and gives the pride of being indigenous Filipino through his teaching method and series of local language novels.



Singapore : Mdm Sarabjeet Kaur d/o Hardip Singh

A teacher who realizes students different learning styles and encourage them through positive learning attitude. Mdm. Sarabjeet teaches science at Amersham Primary School in Singapore. She initiates slow learners, potential and support them to learn with positive thinking. A dedicated teacher pay attention to each detail of each student and understand their learning and behavioral needs. She also helps support her teaching colleagues. Mrs. Sarabjeet also received an Excellent Service Award in Singapore in 2017.



Timor-Leste : Mrs. Leopoldina Joana Gutierrez

A School Director who not only takes care of the school but the well-being of her students and the community. Mrs. Leopoldina Gutierrez is an outstanding principal at St. Joseph Basic Education Central School in Timor-Leste. Her school has a network of several more schools. Vietnam : Mrs. Phan Thi Nu
