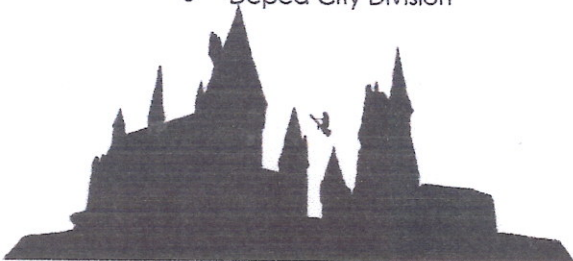

It is an annual, 6-day camping activity of the organization open to all youth (13-25) to further improve unity and camaraderie through outdoor activities and other environment-friendly competitions, indoor interactive sessions, and opinion sharing over essential current youth-related issues.

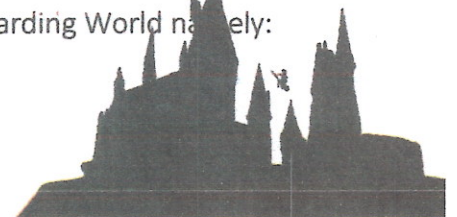
This year's theme: "Implico. Excito. Potest etiam: Engage. Inspire. Empower." focuses in the youth's involvement towards addressing the current social issues and concerns in the community. It aims to let the youth volunteers address these issues through engaging with fellow youth from different parts of the province, inspire them to spearhead in the development of the community and empower them to be a youth advocate for behavioural change. The participants will encounter various approaches concerning mental health issues, child protection policies and disaster risk reduction and management in order to enhance their motivation to make a change and take a stand towards social transformation through our various sessions and outdoor challenges.

I. GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The RCY Bohol Summer Camp 2019 aims to raise awareness among its participants in today's social issues concerning mental health and child protection as well as teaching the participants about disaster risk reduction and management. Further, it also aims to enhance leadership skills and decisiveness of our youth that is vital for their growth and future.

J. METHODOLOGY

The camp will be having break-out sessions and interactions with speaker-facilitators from the different aspects of youth enhancement. They will educate the participants at the same time inspire and encourage them to commit on their responsibility and voluntary service to humanity through addressing to the community's current social issues. The participants will be divided into ten groups. The groups' name is inspired the different houses of the wizarding schools of this year's camp motif Harry Potter and the Wizarding World namely:



- (1) Gryffindor
- (2) Slytherin
- (3) Ravenclaw
- (4) Hufflepuff
- (5) Thunderbird

- (6) Wampus
- (7) Ombrelune
- (8) Bellefeuille
- (9) Horned Serpent
- (10) Pukwudgie

The participants will be sorted through the Sorting Ceremony where a hat will be placed on top of the participant's head as he/she picks a cup from a table, hot water will then be poured out to the participant's cup for him/ her to determine his/ her house for the whole camp.

The sessions will be named according to the subjects of Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry like: (1) "History of Magic: The Red Cross Movement", which tackles about the history and background of the Red Cross Movement; (2) "Defence against the Dark Arts: Disaster Risk Reduction and Management" teaches the participants about disaster preparedness and readiness; (3) "Care of Magical Creatures: Emergency First Aid" which trains the participants emergency response to sudden injuries; (4) "Transfiguration: Child Protection Policy" which aspires the protection of children from violence, exploitation, abuse and neglect; and (5) "Potions: HIV and Substance Abuse Prevention" which aims to raise awareness towards prevention of using harmful substances as well as clarifying the misconceptions of HIV.

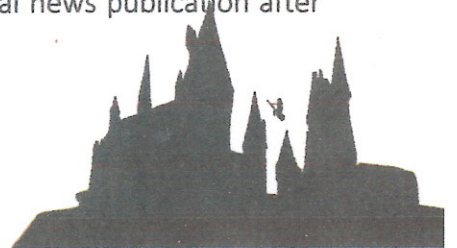
In order to assess their learning, attitude and other necessary skills, the participants will be having outdoor activities and games throughout the duration of the event. One of the camp's highlights is the annual Solferino Race dubbed as "The Triwizard Tournament", a Red Cross Youth-way teambuilding activity, in which the participants will face various challenges that will test their trust, unity and cooperation with one another. There will also be a written exam called as the "O.W.L. - Ordinary Wizarding Level" where participants will be tested according to their understanding and knowledge of all the sessions.

K. EXPECTED PARTICIPANTS

There will be 400 expected youth participants with an age range of 13-25 years old.
