







Speakers' Profile



Kevin Wheatland is an internationally recognized, award-winning thought-leader and management practitioner in the high-technology services industry. He spent 15 years in the Ericsson group headquarters in Sweden, holding director level positions in amongst other roles Service Planning, Services Innovation and Strategic Marketing of Professional Services. He headed up Global Services at Ericsson's Business Systems Division. He is a founding partner of Service Pulse International AB, a Swedish-based consultancy specializing in helping primarily technology-focused organizations.

He has attended multiple CPD programs in Europe and USA on a wide range of subjects and holds a Master of Science degree with distinction in Technology Services Management and has been a visiting professor in the same subject at Liverpool John Moores University. At Ericsson, he was selected for senior executive training. He is a Certified Field Service Manager (CFSM) and also ITIL qualified. He was the main architect of the world's first international Master of Science degree in technology services management.

His affiliations include the Service Alliance at Cambridge University in the UK, the Service Research Center at Sweden's Karlstad University, and the Institute of Directors in London, UK. He has been non-executive director of several company boards in Europe, the USA, Canada and Australia. He has also been the chairman of a UK-based business consultancy.

Among other subjects, Kevin lectures in strategy, transition and transformation, leadership, services marketing and selling, service excellence and operations and personal development. An inspiring speaker, he has trained thousands of executives in over 35 countries. He has published a number of pivotal research reports and articles on service business leadership and is a frequent speaker at senior executive conferences in Europe, USA, Asia, Japan and Australia on multiple services-related subjects.

On a pro-bono basis, he also teaches IT to primary and middle school children in the Philippines and has also been engaged in teaching practical business studies to a group of orphaned and dispossessed children.

Kevin enjoys multi-culturalism, international cuisine and travel. Currently he is learning to play the didgeridoo, an Australian, aboriginal woodwind instrument. Kevin resides in the Philippines together with his Filipina wife and daughter.



Stacy Beth Kurka Monungolh, born in Florida, USA, moved to the Philippines with her family and lived there from 1980-1990 as missionaries. Most of her childhood education was developed in a home-school/small group school using the Abeka Curriculum.

After high school, she moved to Pennsylvania, USA and obtained her Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and Bachelor of Science in Theology in 1995. Having graduated college, she did several teaching stints in Bohol Wisdom School (Tagbilaran City, Bohol, Philippines) as a Values Education Teacher, as well as, teaching American children living in the Philippines in a home-school setting.

In 2000, she became the Director of Aardvark Learning Center in Pennsylvania, USA, managing around 14 staff and 100 children from infancy to kindergarten. During this time she honed her skills in administrating and managing students, parents, teachers, curriculum, facilities, etc. It was also at this time that she earned a professional certificate in Early Childhood Development.

Finally in 2004, Stacy returned to Tagbilaran City, Bohol, Philippines with her family and opened Little Fingers Playschool for three and four year olds. It was her motivation to develop a program that would keep with the academic expectations in the Philippine education system, and yet present the academics in such a way that were developmentally appropriate for the young child. Thus, paving the way for an excited attitude toward learning, regardless of the child's mental and physical ability. What was thought to remain a small playgroup setup has now developed into Prodigy Discovery School, Inc. As word circulated the town and people began to understand and value its program, the demand grew.

Thus, in year 2006, Little Fingers Playschool changed its name to Prodigy Discovery Playschool, Inc. as it registered with DepEd and SEC as a non-stock, non-profit, private preschool and elementary school. Presently, it is now Prodigy Discovery School, Inc. with about 360 children and 40 staff.
