- Empirical essays or manuscripts such as those dealing with relevant issues, arguments, and policies and practice on peacebuilding;
- Literature reviews and thematic briefs on peace policies, programs, and peacebuilding in various identified context
- Scoping Review studies which aim to identify key concepts, theories, evidence, and gaps in research such as role of communications in peacebuilding, and peace education in the curriculum;
- Integrative studies that combine knowledge and methodologies from various disciplines or fields of study such as Social Sciences and Natural Sciences in peacebuilding research, and integrating Arts and Humanities in Peacebuilding; and
- Meta-analytic studies that synthesize literature on peacebuilding, policy briefs, compendium on peace-related materials, peace policy, and programs.
