## BACKGROUND

The Award is part of BCYF's Comprehensive Social Development Program, which consists of PSR - Research, Education, Events, and Developmental Social Enterprise. It was conceived as a result of meeting various organizations and young people who have implemented innovative initiatives that improve their operations and their areas of concern.

The concept for the Award underwent rigorous discussions over time. For a country like the Philippines, and a region like the ASEAN, the five categories were selected because they represent sectors that significantly influence society.

Through the Shell LiveWIRE Program, the global flagship enterprise program of Pilipinas Shell Petroleum Corporation that promotes entrepreneurship, innovation and meaningful employment, the awardee shall receive the 1 Million Pesos cash prize to be used for business upgrades, additions, expansion, or any other steps in order to elevate the innovation.

## CRITERIA OF THE AWARD

1. The Innovation must have been implemented in a viable, functioning and registered organization and/or business for at least two years with a positive cash basis. The innovation must have material impact on the company.
2. There must be a stability of management as proven by Job Description, Work Assignments and Employment Contracts.
3. There must be better-than-sufficient technical facilities, laboratory equipment and technology investment support, including training of appropriate and adequate personnel.
4. There must be proven commitment to sharing the Innovation with others.
5. There must be better-than-full compliance with the letter and intent of all applicable local, national and international rules and regulations.
6. There must be proof of no administrative, civil, or criminal action related to the company, the innovation, or individuals involved in the innovation in all jurisdictions local and foreign.
7. There must be timely submission of all supports and attachments as required by the BIA Search Committee.

## REQUIREMENTS



### I. SUBMISSION OF REQUIREMENTS

1. A 5-minute or less video from the Nominee explaining why they deserve to be the BIA Awardee
2. Proof of existence of innovation such as but not limited to high resolution photos, videos, maps, endorsements, submitted or approved government papers, etc.
3. Discussion of innovation's idea-development, piloting, and commercial operations and prospects, viability and sustainability in writing through the body of the email.
4. Notarized and/or certified submissions are preferred
5. Proof of initiation, start, completion, or ownership of innovation by the Nominee
6. Bio-data or resume with current picture, certification and background of individual, organization and/or team
7. Signed "Privacy" Attachment

### II. NOMINATION PROCESS

1. Anyone can nominate. Self-nomination is highly encouraged.
2. There is no cost involved in the nominations.
3. The nominee must complete all requirements as indicated in the Submission Requirements list prior to sending.
4. All nominations must be notarized and soft-copies must be submitted to [bcyfinnovationaward.bia@gmail.com](mailto:bcyfinnovationaward.bia@gmail.com)
5. All submitted materials become the property of BCYF. The innovation obviously remains the property of the nominee. BCYF will have no claim, whatsoever, over the innovation.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **What is the BIA?**

The BCYF Innovation Award recognizes individuals, teams or organizations who have initiated or developed an Innovation which has improved a process or business/organization.

### **Who may nominate?**

Anyone can nominate. Self-nomination is also encouraged.

### **Who or what can be nominated?**

The Award recognizes Innovation undertaken by a person or a group or an organization that have measurable and demonstrable tangible results improving their operations or their areas of concern.

If an innovation is an iteration of an innovation that has been created or implemented previously by another person/group/organization elsewhere, there should be a provable change in the innovation nominated for it to be qualified in the BCYF Innovation Awards.

**All nominations and other supports submitted should be notarized.**

### **How can I submit a nomination?**

Nominations can be submitted through the online nomination submission system at the BCYF Innovation Awards Facebook page, through our Media Partners, e.g. RMN.

### **What are the categories available for the Award?**

There are 6 categories:

1. Government Service
2. Small-Medium Enterprises (SMEs)
3. Education
4. Technology
5. Industry
6. Health Sciences

Other Innovations may be considered on a case-to case basis.

### **Can I enter a nomination in more than one category?**

Yes, but it has to be a different innovation.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**If I have won, been a finalist, or were previously nominated in the BCYF Innovation Awards (or any of the other BCYF Awards i.e. DSEA, CSRYA, PPA and S4HH) in a previous year, can I still nominate myself/my team/my organization/business in this year's award?**

Yes, as long as you are able to identify a new innovation in the nomination, you are eligible to enter again.

**If an innovation has won an Award already under another award-giving body, can I still nominate that innovation in the BCYF Innovation Awards?**

Yes, as long as it meets the requirements set by the BCYF Innovation Awards Permanent Committee.

**What will happen to the requirements/materials submitted to the BCYF Secretariat (BCYF-SABRE) after the Awards period?**

The BCYF Innovation Awards own the rights to all materials/requirements that will be submitted. They will not be returned. They may also be disposed of.

## THE AWARDEES



### **ENGR. CRISPIN MUYRONG JR. | 2017 - Sunlight Foods Corp.**

Introduced several innovations such as the use of a 1.1-kilowatt evaporative air cooler instead of four units of 2-horsepower conventional freon-operated air-conditioning unit for cooling a 100-square-meter processing area and dropped their power consumption by P418.74 daily, or P120,597 on an annual basis.



### **Onelab, DOST |**

#### **2017- Represented by Usec. Brenda Nazareth-Manzano**

OneLab is an innovation in service delivery that virtually integrates 21 regional and research institute laboratories of DOST, as well as seven other non-DOST laboratories all over the country into a network. The aim is to provide easy-access and wide-ranging service offerings to the manufacturing industries and the general public at a single touch point.



### **ALVIRA CESAR-REYES | 2017 - Bote Central**

Developed the Rearden Roaster coffee-roasting machine to help coffee farmers improve their income. The Rearden Roaster is a 2-kilo batch roaster machine capable of roasting different kinds of beans from moisture levels of the coffee bean between 11 percent and 18 percent.



### **JONATHAN SUY | 2018 - Ana's Breeders Farm**

The leading integrated poultry farm producers of high-quality Broiler Chicken Meat in the Philippines. Its range of operations comprises Feed Mill Plants, Parent Stock Farms, Hatchery, Broiler Farms, Dressing Plant, Cold Storage Facility, and Meat Processing Plant. Their products are highly appreciated for their high nutritional content for their natural guaranteed clean, fresh, canned foods and frozen meat.



### **DR. MA. JOSEFINA ABILAY | 2021 - DOST MIMAROPA**

Cited for her notable contributions to the socio-economic development of the MIMAROPA Region, particularly in the space of poverty alleviation and disaster risk reduction and management and climate change adaptation. DOST-MIMAROPA is at forefront of creating sustainable innovative S&T solutions to long-standing challenges.

## THE BCYF STORY



The Benita & Catalino Yap Foundation was originally established in 1993 as the Catalino D. Yap Foundation, in honor of the late sportsman, educator and civic leader. The elder Mr. Yap was one of the founding Governors of the Philippine Amateur Athletics

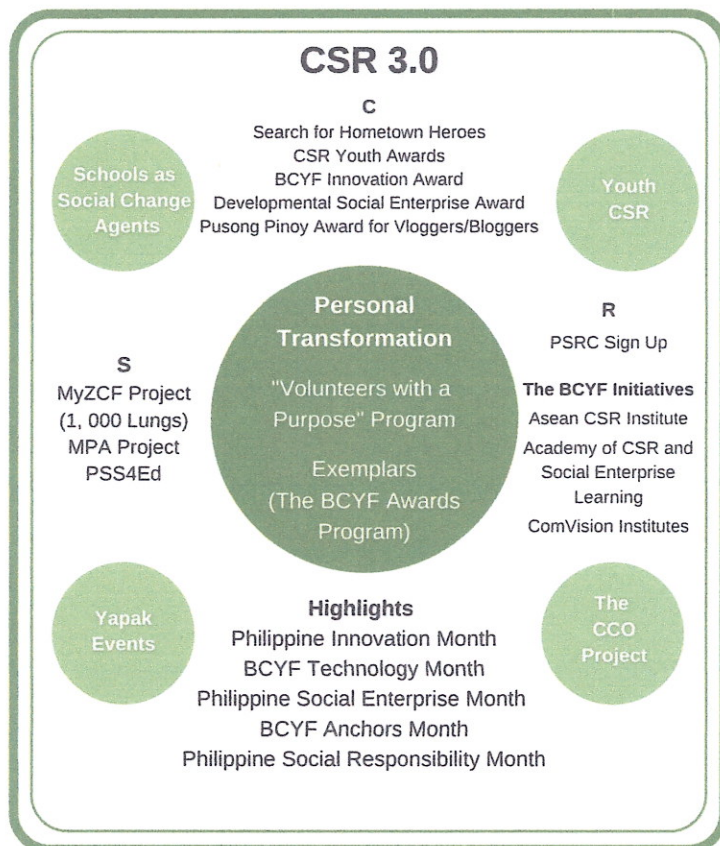
Federation, now known as the Philippine Olympic Committee. He was the head of the Central Luzon Athletics Federation, and was an Officer of the Basketball Association of the Philippines, and the Gymnastics Association of the Philippines.

Dr. Benita Yap was in Education for over 70 years. Author of over a dozen books, Dr. Yap was very much involved in socio-civic and parish groups. BCYF started by supporting groups, organizing Sports Events and providing Scholarships.

It organized The Dalubhasang Tanglaw Awards for Education. In time, the focus would shift to Social Development anchored on PSR.

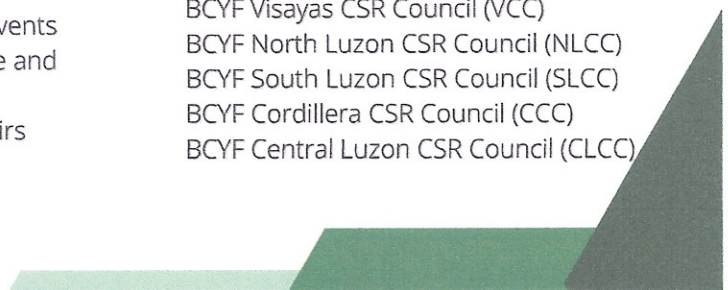
